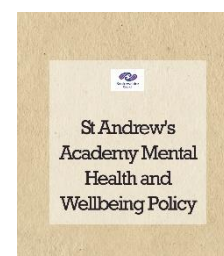
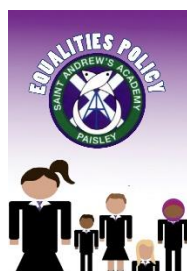
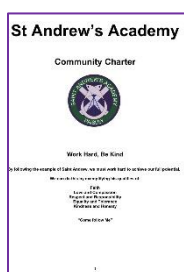

What should I do if my child is absent?

Parents and carers should call the school office on 0300 300 1440 or email standrewsenquires@renfrewshire.gov.uk to report an absence, the Office staff will record the reason for the absence and if known the length. Please call in each morning if you are unable to give a date for return. Our school office opens at 8.30am each school day.

What if my young person has an appointment?

Parents and carers should try to make appointments afterschool or at weekends, where this is not possible, please alert the school office in advance if possible.

Family Holidays during term time

Family holidays during term time should be avoided where possible. Please make a written request to your young persons Guidance Teacher. This absence may be recorded as unauthorised unless it is an exceptional circumstance.

Absence Text Messages Alert

If a young person is absent and we have not had a call from a parent or carer, texts will be sent twice a day, in the morning and in the afternoon to alert you to a pupil absence.

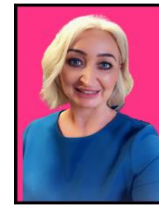
